
TIME Art Clocks - Troubleshooting Information


Thank you for your interest in one of the clocks from the limited edition display created by Raphaé Memon & Sikander Pervez for the Gaggenau London showroom as part of London Festival of Architecture (1st to 30th June 2023).

The 200 clocks were hand-made using plaster of paris. We encourage you to wash your hands after handling the clock.

If your clock stops working, we first recommend you try changing the battery. If this does not work, gently remove the second, minute and hour hands and re-apply see diagrams below. There are also many DIY YouTube videos which help explain this. If one of the hands clashes, remove the battery and re-align as in the diagram below.

In the unlikely event that the clock still doesn't work, you should be able to find inexpensive replacement clock mechanisms online. Please make sure you choose a mechanism with a similar long shaft length.
